

# Riverstone PS – PBL Procedures Information for Parents and Carers


At Riverstone PS, PBL will be implemented as follows:

1. The school expectations are: Safe, Respectful and Learners
2. All staff members will teach the students the expectations and rules through:
  - \* classroom and on site lessons
  - \* signage is displayed in all settings (classrooms to have the signage at the front of the room in full view of the students) and in all settings around the school
  - \* consistent use of common language ('Are you being safe?', 'Are you being respectful?', and 'Are you being a learner?')
  - \* parents can utilise the language in the home environment.
3. All positive rewards are to be entered onto Sentral Wellbeing by the end of each week. These entries would relate to Rocket Awards/ Rocket Stickers handed out.
  - \* students receiving the PBL awards each week will take them home. These can remain at home. This will enable all parents or carers to acknowledge the positive rewards given to the students.
4. All PBL referral slips are filled in at the time of the incident and detention notes for Level 3 incidents are sent home that day with the student. These notes are to come back to school signed the next day. Suspension return to school meetings must take place prior to the student attending school again.

## All Settings - Rocket Award Stickers

Students who are presented with a Rocket Award will also be awarded with a Rocket Award Sticker on their chart. This award is given for upholding the Riverstone core school expectations.

10 Rocket Award Stickers = Bronze Award

20 Rocket A Award Stickers = Silver Award & silver pin

30 Rocket Award Stickers = Gold Award & gold pin

1. Bronze Awards to be handed out at K-6 Assemblies by Classroom Teacher.

2. Silver Awards to be handed out at K-6 Assemblies by Stage Supervisors.
3. Gold Awards to be handed out at K-6 Assemblies by Principal.

## **Silver and Gold Award Days**

All students who have achieved a Silver award and have had 2 or less detentions will attend the Silver Award excursion at the end of term 3. All students who have achieved a Silver award or a Gold award and have had 3 or less detentions will attend the Silver and Gold Award excursion at the end of term 4.

## **All Settings - Pocket Rocket Awards**

Students may be awarded a pocket rocket award for upholding the Riverstone core expectations in all settings. Students who receive Pocket Rockets are responsible to write their name and class on the back. Students place their Pocket Rockets in classroom containers and are emptied weekly into the whole school container by the class SRC Representative.

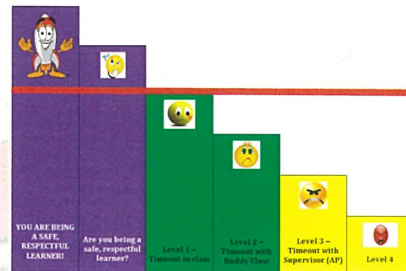
A draw each morning at the lining up assembly will take place and the student drawn out receives a \$1.00 canteen voucher. Pocket Rockets can be used throughout the week as the classroom reward system. They DO NOT go towards Rocket Award Stickers.
